## Summary

## October 2024: Any other comments:

The head is always looking to communicate effectively with parents and I am more than satisfied with the environment my son is taught in. Colney Heath is an excellent school with fantastic staff. "
- My daughter loves her school and her teacher. Colney Heath has had a positive effect on both her learning and her personal development. The staff are hard working and should be congratulated for their efforts. The head is a strong leader and has high expectations for my child. I would recommend the school to anybody, without hesitation. "
- Both of my children enjoy coming to school and feel engaged with what they are taught. I am happy with the assemblies that the school puts on and the after school clubs available.

## Items we are following up...

• Six parents expressed concern about whether the school had high expectations for their child.

Senior leaders monitor the curriculum and teaching and learning through planning, lesson observations and book looks to ensure that standards are at least within the national expectations for the year group. We check children's books to see how individual adaptations have been made for children's needs and attainment. We have termly pupil progress meetings to ensure that each child makes progress.

In November we had a learning review with Spiral MAT. The School Improvement Partner felt that she saw high expectations in all classes.

If you have questions and would like to discuss your child's learning please contact the Head and I will be happy to look at this with you for your child to ensure we are setting high expectations for all our children, and helping them to achieve this.

• Ensuring that the website is updated and that notice is given for cancellations.

The website has an annual check to ensure it has correct statutory information on it. Data and policies are also updated annually.

The children's class pages should have newsletters on them that are updated approximately half termly – or termly depending on if they cover a whole term's learning.

The calendar should have term dates on it for the year, and other dates e.g. assemblies and performances are updated termly.

We aim to communicate cancellations as quickly as we can by email or text. Inevitably, some of these may be at the last minute.

- Availability of after school clubs means that not all children can attend ones that interest them.
   In the last 2 years we have introduced new clubs for art, cookery, cheerleading, multi-sports, rock band and hockey.
   We have offered further clubs for dance but this had insufficient numbers to run. A new Chess Club is due to start soon. We aim to make clubs as accessible as possible, both financially and by trying to spread them across the week.
   Unfortunately, there may be clashes due to availability of the providers, room space or limitations on the age range of children that the club can cater for.
- Clarifying how we deal with concerns about bullying.
   Our survey shows that most parents feel where this happens it is dealt with, but we may need to clarify our policy.
   Our children have questions about how other children behave and how this is dealt with. We need to ensure that they understand terms like bullying but also how behaviour is managed by adults, based on needs and equity.
   If you would like to discuss this, and how you feel this works, please contact the Head. I would value hearing your thoughts and concerns.
- Opportunities to find out about how well your child is doing.
   In addition to Parents' Evenings in the Autumn and Spring Term, parents are invited to class after their child's termly class assembly. This is an excellent opportunity to catch up on your child's learning. The annual report in the summer term gives feedback against age related expectations.

Parents are very welcome to contact the class teacher to have an update in addition to these events.

- Maintenance and cleanliness of the school.

  We are trying to update some areas of the school e.g. our new toilets, better access via the path round the school and shortly, better lighting at night. Germs can spread quickly so we aim to keep facilities sanitary particularly where we know we have several children with the same ailment.
- Opportunities for recognition of personal achievements in assemblies.

  Class assembly on a Friday will now have an opportunity for children to be presented with Times Tables Rock Stars achievements. We try to pass on sporting results when the children have competed in events for the school.
